HS2 Update

Birmingham | Spring 2025

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. This update will provide you with key information and news on HS2 works in Birmingham.

Curzon Street Station Approach Viaducts

The 'Curzon Street Station Approach' refers to the section of the railway between Duddeston Junction Viaduct and Curzon Street Station.

The series of five connected viaducts are:

- Duddeston Mill Viaduct
- Curzon Street No.1 Viaduct
- Curzon Street No.2 Viaduct
- Lawley Middleway Viaduct
- Curzon Street No.3

Curzon Street No.2 Viaduct will carry HS2 over the existing Cross-City railway and will cross the railway above the Grade II listed Lawley Street Viaduct.

This viaduct will be located east of Birmingham City Centre, south of the Duddeston area of Birmingham and north of the Bordesley area of Birmingham. It will be approximately 600 meters east of the new Curzon Street Station.

Update on Aston Church Road

The new temporary footpath along Aston Church Road is now open. The newly constructed overbridge will stay in place and Aston Church Road will be realigned to follow the new overbridge. This will allow access for pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles.

Currently, Aston Church Road is still closed to vehicles whilst we divert utilities and construct the new road layout. Aston Church Road is scheduled to re-open late 2025.

Lawley Middleway	April 2025	Night -time closure with diversions in place	Construction of tripods and push new deck across Lawley Middleway this summer

Tunnel Boring Machine breakthrough expected late spring

The Bromford Tunnel is a 3.5-mile twin-bore tunnel connecting Water Orton to Washwood Heath. The two Tunnel Boring Machines (TBM's) being used to excavate the tunnel are Mary Ann (digging the first bore) while TBM Elizabeth, is currently advancing through the second bore.

Both TBM's are progressing around 15meters per day with Mary Ann currently located near Bromford Central (near The Fort shopping centre). Mary Ann has completed 5,113 meters and is 88% of the way through her journey to the West Portal at Washwood Heath.

Elizabeth is currently located in Castle Vale, has completed 3,111metees, and is 54% of the way through her journey to the West Portal at Washwood Heath. The first bore is due to break through this spring.

Washwood Heath contracts award

Contracts have now been awarded to the teams that will deliver the high-speed rail project's state-of-the-art track, signalling, communications, and other systems. The award of contracts marks the start of a new stage for the project.

A vast network of optical fibre cabling will form the railway's central nervous system – providing signalling and communications for staff and passengers.
