HS2 Update

South Warwickshire | Spring 2025

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. This update will provide you with key information and news on HS2 works in South Warwickshire.

A46 Overbridge

Following the full three-week closure of the A46 at the end of April 2025, we successfully moved the huge 14,500 tonne box into position. We reopened road 30 hours ahead of schedule.

We completed the operation in three stages. The first stage involved the demolition of a 200m long section of the old road and the excavation of around 35,000 cubic metres of material to make space for the box to be pushed into place.

The second stage involved pushing the 42-metre-wide structure into position, achieved over 10 hours. We used 15 enormous jacks to guide the box into position, using a series of holes in the base of the box. We injected bentonite – a clay-based material – into the space between the box and the ground to help ease the sliding operation.

Did you know?

The box structure weighs around the same as two new Royal Navy destroyers, which makes it one of the heaviest of its kind in Europe.

The final stage of the operation saw the embankment carefully reconstructed, the new carriageway put into place and the road reopened early.

Building the bridge offline avoided over two years of ongoing traffic management, speed restrictions and road realignments. Enabling long-term benefits with far less disruption for the community and road users.

Welsh Road Underbridge and realignment

We completed the construction of Welsh Road Underbridge at the end of November 2024, a key milestone for the project.

It is the first of 16 bridge structures to be built in South Warwickshire. Once we completed the bridge, we started work on the new road realignment, which was progressed and opened for road users in February 2025.

The Welsh Road Underbridge is located around 400 metres north of the Grand Union Canal and will carry the high-speed trains over the realigned Welsh Road. To reduce impact on the environment and minimise road closures, the Underbridge was built offline - next to the carriageway.

The structure is a reinforced concrete box measuring 30 metres long, almost 13 metres wide and 8 metres high. It was constructed over a period of 23 months using 2,020 cubic metres of concrete, enough to fill an Olympic-size swimming pool.

Burton Green Tunnel and Cromwell Lane update

We have passed the halfway mark of the construction of the 700-metre Burton Green Tunnel in Warwickshire. This tunnel will transport HS2 trains through Burton Green, near Kenilworth and will be integrated into the landscape with trees, plants, and shrubs, along with a green space for local community use.

We are building the Burton Green tunnel using a 'top down' construction method, where the side walls and roof are constructed at ground level before excavating the tunnel itself, culminating in the construction of the base. Over the past year, progress has accelerated, with the completion of the 200-metre southern portal entrance and various underground structures, including retaining walls and over 1,300 concrete piles, using 33,000 cubic metres of concrete.

Upcoming phases involve further excavation, with soil reused for landscaping, and the installation of roof and base slabs, as well as internal structures. The utility services, which were temporarily diverted to enable the tunnel works, will be diverted back under Cromwell Lane before the road can be constructed to its original alignment. These works will require a series of temporary closures over the summer and early 2026. We will communicate the dates once they are confirmed.

Traffic management

To enable us to complete works on our bridge structures, we will need to implement some traffic management including road closures. Please see the below update on upcoming traffic management.
