#### **Summer 2025**

This look ahead covers HS2 works in Brent and Ealing to build four vent shafts and the HS2 London tunnels. It also covers associated activities such as utility and bridge surveys and protection works along the HS2 London tunnels route. For information about works around Old Oak Common station, please see our Old Oak and North Acton look ahead.

The document includes:

- A forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months; and
- Works to be aware of that will take place in the next 12 months, but may not yet have been confirmed.

		Welfare facilities at our Canterbury Works Ventilation and Headhouse site will be used during this period.

		Start the installation of a temporary power supply along West Gate to the Westgate Vent Shaft site.

Location 1 Green Park Way site	June to August 2025	<ul> <li>During this period, we'll:</li> <li>Build adits (horizontal passages) below ground that will connect the HS2 tunnels;</li> <li>Remove water from the ground as works continue to build the shafts;</li> <li>Carry out Network Rail track maintenance works as required; and</li> </ul>

		Disassemble and remove the four tunnel boring machines from the tunnels using a large crane.  Some activities at this site will require extended working hours.

		Build adits (horizontal passages) that will connect the HS2 tunnels below ground;
		<ul> <li>Build the headhouse (the building that sits on top of the ventilation shaft) including base slab concrete;</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Complete construction of the twin-bore Northolt Tunnel West from West Ruislip at the Green Park Way Vent Shaft site;</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Complete construction of the twin-bore Northolt Tunnel East from Old Oak and Park Royal to the Green Park Way Vent Shaft site;</li> </ul>

Location 1 Mandeville Road site	June to August 2025	<ul> <li>Continue works to build the vent shafts including basement ventilation;</li> <li>Break and remove concrete from the site until September 2025, some of these works will take place during 24 hour works Mondays to Fridays.</li> <li>Operate two large cranes to move materials and construction equipment;</li> <li>Build the base slab for the headhouse including ducting and drainage; and</li> <li>Install reinforce concrete walls for the headhouse.</li> </ul>

Location 1 Mandeville Road site  Autumn 2025 to autumn 2026	Autumn 2025 to autumn 2026	<ul> <li>During this period, we'll:         <ul> <li>Continue work to build the vent shafts including basement ventilation and other internal structures such as stairs, lifts and doors;</li> <li>Operate two large cranes to move materials and construction equipment;</li> <li>Connect the shafts to the tunnels;</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Continue works to build the headhouse;</li> <li>Install brickwork and cladding on the headhouse;</li> <li>Install mechanical, electrical and plumbing services in the headhouse;</li> <li>Install a high voltage power cable;</li> <li>Install and operate a secondary vehicle access point to site from early 2026 – this remains subject to approval;</li> <li>Install piles in the railway embankment area for ground support;</li> <li>Install permanent utilities for the headhouse; and</li> </ul>	

		<ul> <li>Carry out groundworks and landscaping within the site boundary.</li> </ul>

- **Consulting**: Formally consult with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b (we now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a)

### Our commitments to you

#### **Informing**

- We will tell you about HS2 works in your area.
- We have local community websites and newsletters with regular information and updates about our work in your area.
- We have local community teams who know your area. They will hold local events and run projects to keep you informed.

#### **Involving**

- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

#### Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

#### Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to carry out things that fall outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
