These works are to help us prepare the realignment on the northern section of Old Oak Common Lane, as well as facilitating future tunnel connections and continuing with critical utility works.

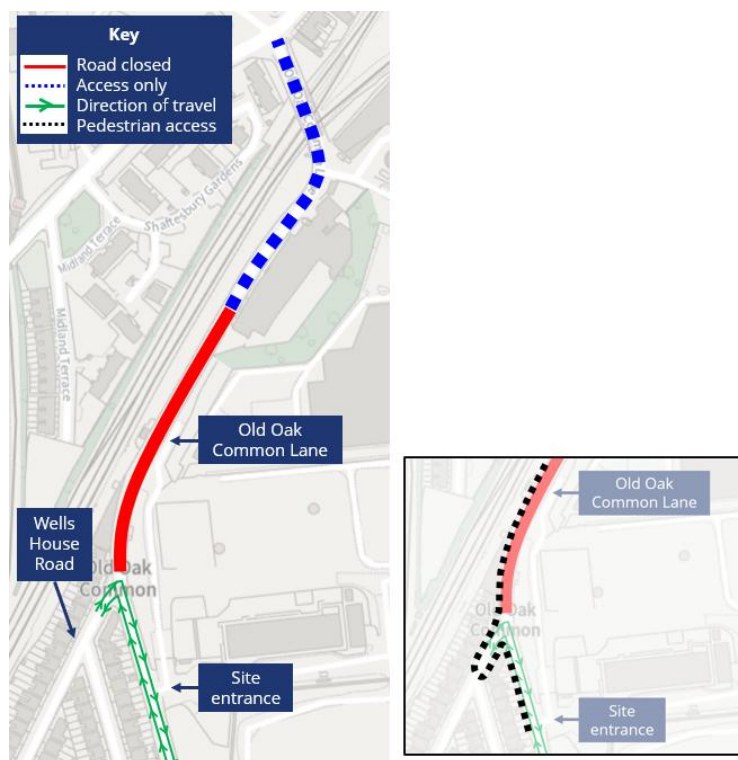
Utility works: These are gas and water diversion works which we informed you about in our latest traffic management newsletter, which you can access online:

The work will include:

- Removing paving slabs
- Breaking out concrete
- Excavating carriageway to install utility mains
- Vac excavation work

To reduce the amount of time we have the traffic lights in operation, we will be working over the weekend. There will be no interruption to supply for the community and pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the works. The work will be noisy, but we will do everything we can to minimise disruption such as using acoustic barriers and where safe to do so, we'll use innovative measures such as a shroud which is an enclosure designed to absorb or block sound.

Tie ins for the northern realignment:

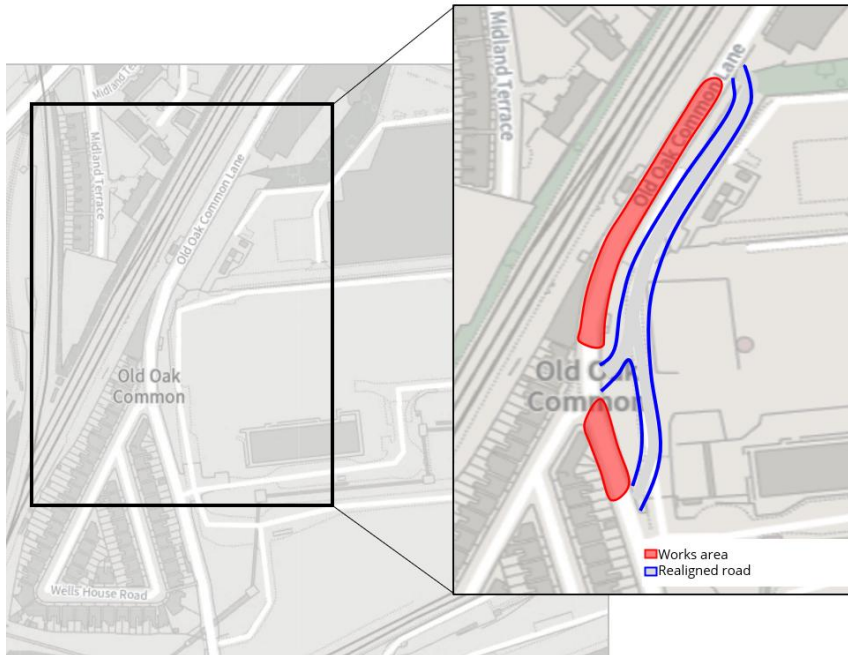
To help us construct the northern realignment on Old Oak Common Lane, there will be two weekends when Old Oak Common Lane will be closed to allow the new and existing stretches of road to be connected. This will help us lay out the new foundations for the road. Work over these weekends will include:

- Plaining out the road (with a machine like a combine harvester)
- Realigning tarmac
- Lining the road
- Utility connections

We will confirm the timings and exact locations of these closures as soon as possible.

Please see map of how the road will be aligned in the future.

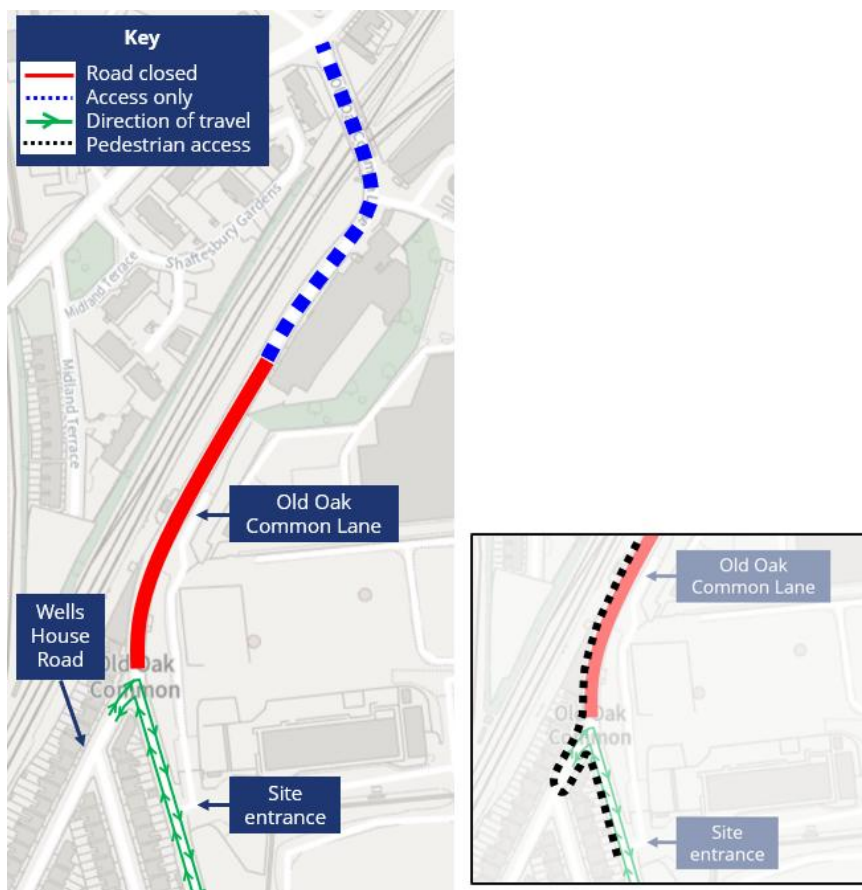


Friday 28 November, Saturday 29 November and Sunday 30 November 2025 (overnight only 8pm-5am)

Sewer works:

As part of our station enabling works, we need to connect the tunnelling from our HS2 SCS site to Old Oak Common. There is a waste sewer pipe that runs up and down Old Oak Common Lane. To futureproof this pipe for these works, we need to line the sewer to protect it for when the tunnelling works commence. There will be no impact on residential services during any of these works. You can see a map of the road closure on the next page.
