HS2 Update

Staffordshire | Autumn 2025

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high-speed railway for Britain. This update will provide key information and news on HS2 works between Drayton Bassett and Handsacre.

HS2 reset update

Mark Wild was appointed as CEO of HS2 in December 2024. He is now overseeing a 12-month reset of the HS2 programme, reviewing costs and schedule to ensure we deliver the railway efficiently.

In March 2023 some of our works in Staffordshire, were paused by the previous government. We now have a multi-year financial settlement for the project - set out in the recent Spending Review. We must stay within our annual budget and focus resource on building the initial phase of the railway. To enable us to achieve this, we have taken the decision to extend the pause in Staffordshire for a further four years.

The pause will prioritise efforts and resources on the opening section of HS2 between Old Oak Common and Birmingham - getting the construction programme back in the right order.

Some essential construction works in this area will continue. This also includes the completion of works on the A5 overbridge and the realignment of the A38.

We are committed to keeping you informed about our works and further updates will be shared as the reset progresses.

A38 update

Works continue on the A38 in Lichfield

Works continue to progress on the A38 in Lichfield. In late 2024, the northbound slip road reopened on its temporary alignment.

Implementing a temporary alignment has minimised the impact to road users by ensuring the slip road has remained open for the current phase of the works.

Throughout 2025, there have been ongoing works, including piling works which have resulted in overnight closures.

Later in 2025 we will be carrying out some work that may require some further overnight closures to safely facilitate these works; however, we will communicate this with you nearer the time.

Looking ahead into 2026, we plan to commence the final phases of the works which involve a series of closures on the A38 to construct the new permanent alignment.

On completion of the realignment, which is estimated to be Spring 2026, the Northbound Streethay Slip Road will remain closed for approximately 12 months.

This will allow Rykneld street overbridge to be completed followed by the new slip road.

Once the programme and traffic management are confirmed, we will communicate these works with you, through Advance Warning Notifications, communications toolkits, issuing of diversion routes and drop-in events where you will be able to find out more about these planned closures.

All future works on the A38 are subject to consent.

A5 update

Overbridge works are underway along the A5

Construction has resumed on the overbridge for the railway to pass beneath the A5 Hints Bypass and Watling Street. A contraflow system will remain in place on the A5 to ensure safe vehicle movement of construction traffic.

Once piling is complete, structural works will begin with completion expected in 2027.

Inspiring future generations

We had the pleasure of visiting Willows Primary School in Lichfield to deliver four STEM activity days for students from Year 1 to Year 6. Pupils focused on the route of the railway. We encouraged teamwork as pupils designed and built structures. They also explored our ecological work, with our Senior Ecologist leading discussions on local wildlife and conservation. As part of the hands-on experience, students also built bird boxes that are now proudly displayed around the school grounds.
