HS2 traffic management update

Old Oak Common Lane | January – March 2026

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high-speed railway for Britain. BBVS is the contractor working on behalf of HS2 to construct Old Oak Common Station

Traffic management update

As we continue with the construction programme at the Old Oak Common station site, we will be working along Old Oak Common Lane **between January and March 2026**. We need to manage traffic safely around our works to replace utility services.

We anticipate traffic on Old Oak Common Lane will be heavier than usual over the next few months and we strongly encourage you to leave extra time for your journey. Please regularly check in online or via our community noticeboards for updates.

A number of these works are subject to approvals from the local authorities and could be subject to late changes. We will let you know of any changes via the HS2 website and email notifications.


Works scheduled from January 2026

Utility works to the north on Old Oak Common Lane

In our previous newsletter, we outlined work that is due to continue until **Monday 9 February** near Kildun Court. You can read that edition here: <https://www.hs2.org.uk/about-us/documents/old-oak-common-lane-traffic-management-update-october-december-2025/>

Temporary two-way traffic lights are in place and the eastern footpath, opposite Kildun Court, will be closed. This work is in part to divert the route of a major Thames Water main under Old Oak Common Lane and is complex. There are also contractors working on the northern road realignment (see following page), which is why the traffic management must stay in place.

We are installing new sections of pipe, building concrete supports for the pipe and carrying out connection work, while keeping London's water supply running without interruption.

Utility works to the south on Old Oak Common Lane

Until **Saturday 21 February 2026**, there will be temporary two-way traffic lights in place while Cadent Gas continue to connect gas mains and other works.



The temporary traffic arrangements above will be in place until 21 February

Works scheduled from February 2026

Northern realignment of Old Oak Common Lane

The northern section of Old Oak Common Lane is temporarily being realigned into our site and is currently scheduled to be open for traffic on 9 February 2026. The new layout is required to allow traffic and pedestrians to use the road while we connect pipes and cables within our site to existing utilities in Old Oak Common Lane.


Overnight closure of Old Oak Common Lane 8 February to 9 February 2026

Old Oak Common Lane will be closed to connect the new white road markings to the existing road markings and to install barriers around the landscape area. This closure will be in place from **10:00pm on Sunday 8 February until Monday 9 February at 4:00am**.

These dates are subject to change, and we will update the community if they do.



Map of closure of Old Oak Common overnight from 10:00pm Sunday 8 to 4:00am Monday 9 February




Map showing location of temporary realignment of Old Oak Common north from February 2026

Utility works to the north on Old Oak Common Lane

Following the opening of the northern realignment, currently scheduled on Monday 9 February, we will be continuing works with Cadent Gas. These require a closure of the southbound lane of the realigned section of Old Oak Common Lane from **Monday 9 February to Saturday 28 February**.

If the realignment opening is delayed, the dates of these works will also change, and we will update this newsletter.

Extending the lane closure on Old Oak Common Lane


Between **Saturday 28 February and Saturday 21 March**, we will be restarting the gas and water diversion supplies and changing old, cast-iron pipes for modern plastic pipes. This is a continuation of the work that took place late in 2025. There will be no interruption to supply for the community.

The work will include:

- Four-way traffic lights with Wells House Road, the station site entrance and Old Oak Common to the north and to the south. Southbound lane closure on Old Oak Common Lane
- Access to properties will be maintained throughout, but we will be speaking directly to residents at the north of Wells House Road about the impacts of these works early in February
- Parking bay suspensions; one disabled parking bay will be moved. We will be in touch with residents whose parking bays are restricted about possible mitigations
- Landscape garden area at the entrance of the road will be removed. We have been in contact with residents with further information and details of mitigations
- Temporary route for pedestrians on Old Oak Common Lane
- One lane suspended in Wells House Road

We apologise in advance for the longer delays to traffic as a result of the four-way lights.

Signs in the area will advise through traffic to use alternative routes.
