Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Colne Valley viaduct, A412 North Orbital Way, Bucks	Ongoing to Jan 2026	Landscaping works are currently being conducted and will be completed in January 2026.
Multiple locations	Ongoing until the end of the project	Continuing with water quality sampling from the Newyears Green Bourne until July 2025. The River Colne will be surveyed until 2050. Samples of water are taken from streams in the area each month. This is done by staff on foot taking a jam-jar sized sample for analysis.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Moorhall Road	Ongoing to December 2026	Fencing and planting to be completed by May 2026 to the north side of the Moorhall Road slipway construction.
		Car park, fencing and landscaping works to be completed by December 2026 to the south of the Moorhall Road earthworks.

Location 2 Colne Valley lakes	Ongoing to September 2026	The Colne Valley viaduct has now been constructed across the Colne Valley lakes. Work to remove the temporary jetties has been completed and landscaping is being carried out around the piers and lake edges.
Location 3 Dews Lane/South Embankment	Ongoing to May 2026	Landscaping works to the south of New Years Green Bourne will be completed by December 2025. Stockpiles in the stockpile area have been removed, and soiling is due to be completed by
		May 2026. Work compound and offices have been removed while the HOAC car park area is due to be removed and the area landscaped by May 2026.
Location 4 Harvil Road	Ongoing to June 2026	Permanent lights are now installed to control construction traffic movement at the junction with Dews Lane and Harvil Road.
Location 5 Denham Country Park	No further works	National Grid pylon diversion works have been completed.
Location 6 Dews Lane / Newyears Green Bourne	Ongoing to December 2025	The Colne Valley viaduct has now been constructed and the launching girder, that built the viaduct, has been dismantled and removed from site. Earthworks and landscaping will continue in this location, including the construction of a concrete platform for an auto transformer feeder station which will supply electricity to the operational railway.
Location 7 Savay Lake to Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	Ongoing to December 2026	Fencing and landscaping works are still required at Pier 20 until December 2026.
Location 8 Harefield Lake No2	Ongoing to December 2025	Landscaping around the edges of the lake.

Location 9	Ongoing to	Landscaping of the South Embankment area
South Embankment	December 2025	between Harefield No2 Lake and Harvil Road.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
South Ruislip Vent Shaft	Ongoing until December 2026	During this period, we will continue building the headhouse (this is the building above the shaft, which will be used for ventilation and emergency access).
	Ongoing until September 2026	During this period, we will build the southern, western and eastern site boundary walls.
	Ongoing until February 2026	During this period, we will install cladding onto the auto transformer station building. (Auto transformer stations allow for electrical power to be transferred from the National Grid network to the railway.)
	Ongoing until May 2026	During this period, we will carry out utility connections along the site boundary and within the site.

	January 2026 to May 2026	During this period, we will carry out reinforced concrete work and blockwork within the main shaft.
Location 3 West Ruislip Portal	Ongoing	 During this period, we will: remove the tunnelling support structures and conveyor bridges from the West Ruislip Portal; build the mechanical, electrical and plumbing equipment in the shaft, headhouse and auto transformer station; construct the boundary fencing and carry out landscaping work; and undertake the architectural fit-out for the shaft and headhouse.
Various locations along the HS2 tunnel route	Ongoing	During this period, we will remove ground movement monitoring equipment from buildings and structures along the Northolt Tunnel route.

Involving

We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.

We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.

If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.

An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.

We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
