

# Update: Overnight and weekend works in April to May 2026

### What we are doing

Overnight L-Unit install in Camden Cutting North area of site.

Daytime and evening working on Granby Terrace Bridge and Euston Throat area.

Hoarding maintenance works.

### What to expect

Lane closure on Hampstead Road.

Periods of increased noise before 10pm.

Monitoring of our works to ensure we are working within approved noise limits.

### **Installation of L-units in Camden Cutting north**

We'll continue installing concrete support structures, known as L-units close to the Network Rail tracks. We'll lift the L-units via the lorry lay-by on Park Village East into site using the tower crane and secure them into place. We'll work from 9am on Saturday to 9am on Sunday to install the L-units while the tracks are not in use. We do not expect these works to be noisy.

We'll work from **9am** on Saturday to **9am** on Sunday on the following dates:

- **Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 May**
- **Saturday 23 and Sunday 24 May**
- **Saturday 30 and Sunday 31 May**

### **Weekend working in Euston Throat**

We are continuing our works to remove the Network Rail wall in the Euston Throat area.

We will work during the day as required to remove the scaffold and make amendments to the hoarding. We can only carry out these works when the rail tracks below are not in use. We do not expect these works to be noisy.

We will work on Saturdays and Sundays, **9am to 9pm** on the following dates:

- **Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 May**
- **Saturday 16 and Sunday 17 May**

### **Utility works close to Granby Terrace Bridge**

In preparation for Transport for London (TfL) to test their cable connections, we need to excavate the area where we completed the ducting and cabling works for the utility containment units across Granby Terrace Bridge. We will excavate and expose the cable ducts and joints on **Saturday 25 and Sunday 26 April**. TfL will then test their cable connections. If we need to make any changes to the existing cable ducts and joints, we will use **Saturday 2 and Sunday 3 May** to make these changes, and use **Saturday 9 and Sunday 10** to reinstate the area. These works need to be completed at the weekend when our site haul route is not in use.

You may notice an increase in noise whilst we excavate the area. We'll work during the day, from **8am to 6pm** on Saturday, and **10am to 6pm** on Sunday.

### **Hoarding maintenance on Hampstead Road**

We carry out regular maintenance to our site hoarding on Hampstead Road once a month on a Saturday night. We plan to carry out this work overnight on **Saturday 30 May**.

We'll temporarily close the northbound lane on Hampstead Road and maintain two-way traffic in the southbound lane. You may notice brief periods of noise as we clean the road and hoarding.

### **Large load movements**

To help with our deliveries and collections, we regularly have large loads delivered to or collected from our worksite via Hampstead Road gate and the Vehicle Holding Area. For safety reasons, these loads need to be moved at night or early morning to avoid peak traffic hours.

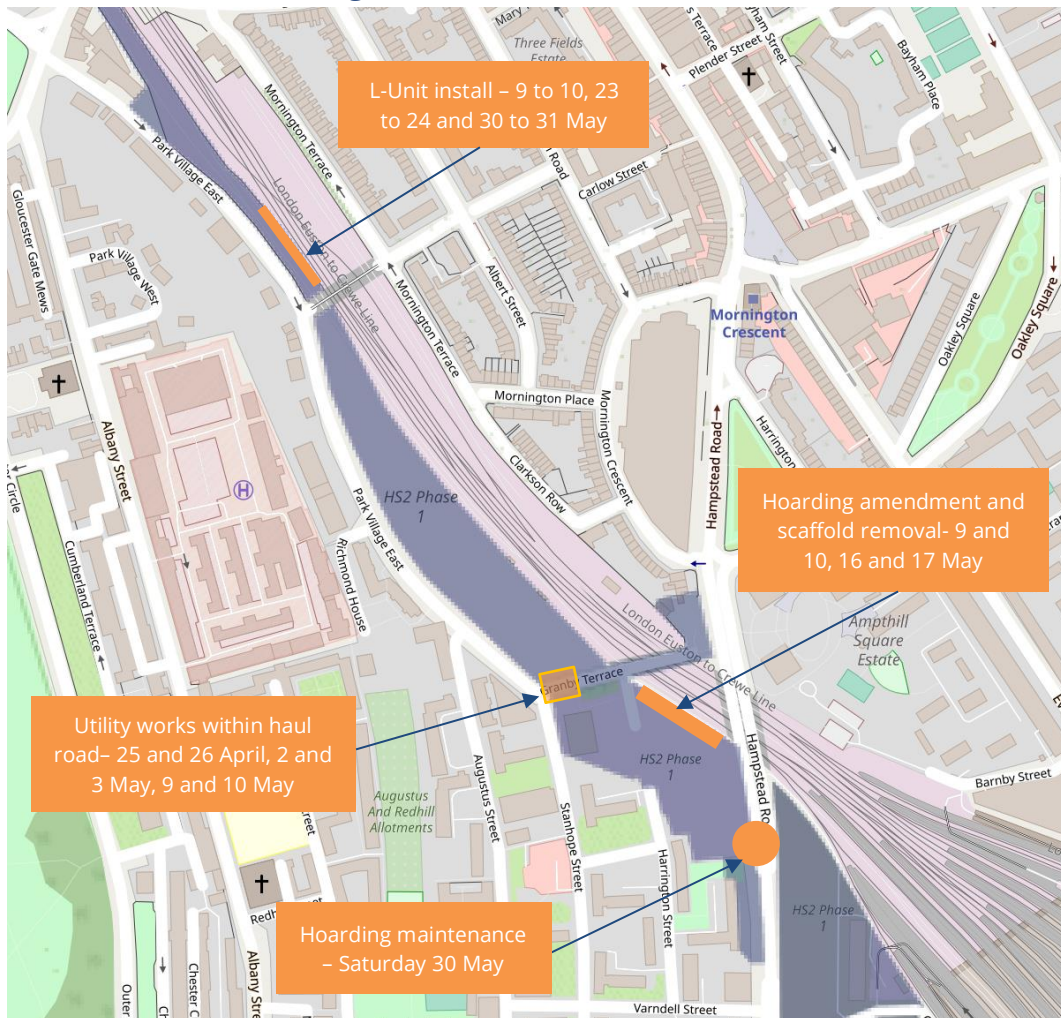
Due to the size and weight of these loads there may be occasions where our approved lorry routes are not suitable, and the haulier may need to use alternative roads. Our traffic management team will be present to assist the haulier in safely navigating the route and traffic marshals will be on site to guide lorries in and out of our worksites.

These movements will continue on various dates throughout the duration of the project.
