Parkway utility works – February to October

We need to protect and divert utility services beneath Parkway junction and in the surrounding area before the tunnel boring machine passes beneath. In February we started our utility works on the sewers, water mains and power cables on Parkway, Albert Street and Delancey Street. We expect to complete these works in October 2026.

In autumn 2026, we'll return to Parkway to complete protective works to the Cadent Gas main.

The installation and removal of traffic management (TM) on the highway is subject to 24hrs/7-days working arrangements to allow for maintenance and any necessary changes to the traffic management setup. This is also a safety requirement to ensure the works can be carried out safely and efficiently during these periods.

Albert Street Thames Water monitoring – 13 July to 14 August

We previously informed you that we would install monitoring equipment on the Thames Water main on Albert Street. These works started on 13 July. We've closed the eastern section of the road, and suspended parking bays to maintain a safe working area. Vehicle access from Parkway will be maintained. We'll excavate the area, install monitoring equipment and then reinstate the area. From 29 July we have closed the footpath outside of 128 Albert Street, pedestrians will be diverted to the opposite side of the road. We previously informed you that we expect these works to be completed by **7 August**, unfortunately due to some technical issues experienced we now expect works to finish on **14 August**.

Parkway Thames Water monitoring – 14 July to 6 September

We previously informed you that we would install monitoring equipment on the Thames Water main on Parkway. These works started on 14 July. We've closed two west side lanes on Parkway, which will close the left-hand turn onto Gloucester Avenue and one of the northbound lanes towards Parkway one way system. Traffic will be diverted via Prince Albert Road, Albert Terrace, Regent's Park Road and back onto Gloucester Avenue. We'll excavate the area, install monitoring equipment and then reinstate the area. We expect this work to be completed by **6 September**.

Utility trial holes (Gas main) – 12 to 21 August

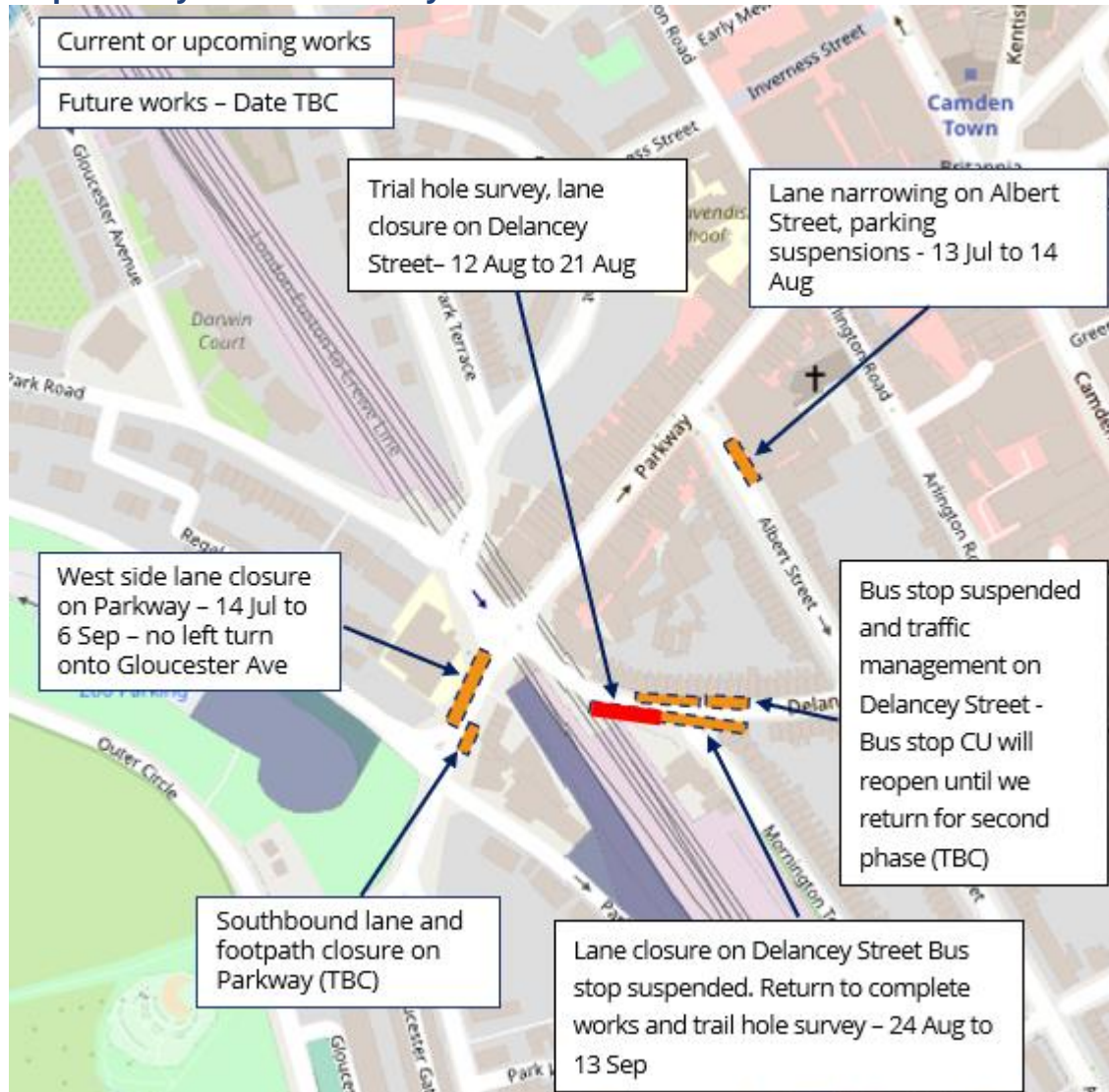
We previously informed you on **10 August** we would carry out trial hole surveys to help inform us about the design of the gas mitigation works in Autumn 2026. Unfortunately, due to technical issues experienced and delayed working hours due to weather temperature, works will now start from **12 August to 21 August**. We'll close the southern lane on Delancey Street close to the junction of Mornington Terrace and will require parking bay suspensions on Mornington Terrace. Bus stop CU will remain open. We'll dig a trial hole, carry out the survey and reinstate the area. We expect to complete these works by **21 August**.

Utility works (UKPN cable route) on Delancey Street – 24 August to 13 September

On **24 August** we'll return to continue with diverting a section of the UK Power Networks cable route and complete trial hole surveys on Delancey Street. We'll work in the southern lane of Delancey Street and close the road at the junction of Delancey Street and Mornington Terrace. Traffic will be diverted via Mornington Street, Albert Street and Delancey Street. We'll require lane and footpath closures and parking bay suspensions in this area. Bus stop CU will be suspended. We expect to complete these works by **13 September**.

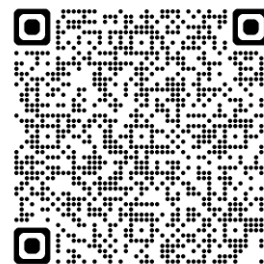
