

# Demolishing old bridge walls on Old Oak Common Lane

### Location

Old Oak Common Lane closure for works at site of former Wycombe line bridge

### Duration

Friday 17 April 10:00pm until Monday 20 April 5:00am

### What we are doing

We will remove the supporting walls (called 'abutments') of the former Wycombe line bridge between our site and the remaining bridge on Old Oak Common Lane. The main section of the bridge was demolished in 2023

### What to expect

A weekend road closure. There will be noisy works on the site side of Old Oak Common Lane. Twenty-four-hour working; excavators breaking concrete until late evening; removing debris overnight. We will use noise reduction methods such as acoustic blankets

## **Weekend road closure for demolition and removal of Wycombe bridge supports**

**10:00pm Friday 17 April to 5:00am Monday 20 April**

The railway bridges on Old Oak Common Lane between our site entrance and Minster in the south are gradually all being demolished and will be rebuilt as part of the programme to construct Old Oak Common station. The new bridges will carry the realigned Great Western Main Line and other railways into the station.

We have already removed the bridge deck of the former Wycombe line bridge in spring 2023. We now need to demolish the remaining supporting walls, or abutments, on the site side (the east) of Old Oak Common Lane.

This work will take place during a weekend road closure of Old Oak Common Lane. We will work over three nightshifts and two dayshifts. Resident and guest vehicles accessing Wells House Road between Friday 17 and Monday 20 April should enter and leave from the north, near the Atlas Road roundabout. Pedestrian access will stay open along the whole length of Old Oak Common Lane while the works take place.

We'll remove site hoarding over the night of Friday 17 April. The demolition works will start on Saturday 18 April at 9:00am. We will use two large excavators equipped with breakers to demolish the brick walls. We will use sound-absorbing 'shrouds', which are special, portable acoustic barriers, to minimise noise and this loud work will stop at 8:00pm. We will also use dust suppression methods and additional acoustic blankets to limit disruption.


During the night shift, the waste from demolition work will be removed by lorry. The waste will consist of heavy materials such as bricks and removing the material will be noisy at times. We will prioritise noisier works, for example breaking the abutment, during the day to minimise disruption for the community. We will also be offering hotels to residents most impacted during these works.

While the road closure is in place, we will also be renewing the white lining on the stretch of Old Oak Common by Minster. Removing the old markings will be noisy as we have to roughen and scrape away the surface layer using machines before painting on new white lines. This will be done within our core working hours between 8:00am and 5:00pm.

Work will continue in this area until around spring 2027 with various changes to pedestrian routes but we will be in touch with further details of this work later in the year.
