

Old Oak Common Lane weekend closures and Wells House Road stairs update

Location

Old Oak Common Lane (between the HS2 site entrance and railway bridges)

Duration

- Road closure hours: Saturday 13 June 6am to Sunday 14 June 10pm
- Saturday 20 June 6am to Sunday 21 June 10pm (contingency 27-28 June)
- Working hours: 8am-5pm

What we are doing

We are reopening the footpath on the eastern (station site) side of Old Oak Common Lane. This is ahead of the footpath closure on the western side for works on the Wells House Road stairs and adjoining bridge.

What to expect

We will be dismantling our hoarding and moving the blocks onto our site using an excavator. We will be carrying out additional preparatory work on the Wells House Road stairs on the opposite side of the road. There will be road closures on Old Oak Common Lane.

Weekend closures

The footpath on the eastern – station site – side of Old Oak Common Lane, which was taken into our site, is being restored. This is ahead of works to the Wells House Road stairs on the opposite side of the road and the bridge adjoining it. During the weekend closures, we will be dismantling our hoarding and moving it onto our site using an excavator. We will do this within our working hours of 8am–5pm each day. The eastern footpath will then be reopened, this currently scheduled to be in the first week of July (more information to follow).

Access to Wells House Road

While Old Oak Common Lane is closed, Wells House Road residents and visitors can enter and exit by vehicle to the north – towards the Atlas Road roundabout and Nadi Centre.

The pavement on Old Oak Common Lane will be open to allow access for pedestrians in both directions during these works.

Where we will be working

Wells House Road stairs

We are preparing to repair and rebuild the stairs at Wells House Road. This includes removing damaged sections and constructing new supporting walls and steps.

We will begin during the weekend closure of Old Oak Common Lane of 13–14 June, when we will put up temporary works structures (scaffolding) that we will use for the duration of the works.

On Saturday 13 June, a delivery vehicle, fitted with a small crane, will unload the material, and our team will use hand tools to do the work. Pedestrians on the Wells House Road-side pavement will be directed via a prepared route around the works.

Where we will be working

We will be working in the location below on the weekend of 13–14 June



We will be distributing a more detailed notification of the main works soon.

Residents in this area should expect some disruption from noise and vibration as we demolish and rebuild the steps. There may be some work that requires traffic and pedestrian management at the bottom of the steps on Old Oak Common Lane.
