

Old Oak Common Lane: single lane closure for Wells House Road stairs work update 02/09/26

Location

Old Oak Common Lane (between the HS2 site entrance and railway bridges)

Duration

From Friday 24 July, intermittently as required – see details on the next page, updated on Wednesday 2 September. Please note, these are subject to change, and we may not close the lane on all dates. Working hours: 8am-5pm (although the lane closure will last until up to 6pm)

What we are doing

We are closing a single lane of traffic, to allow space, so that we can rebuild the pedestrian stairs between Wells House Road and Old Oak Common Lane.

What to expect

Single lane closures northbound on Old Oak Common Lane. Two-way traffic will be controlled by temporary traffic lights with full access to Wells House Road from both directions. We have made sure that there are no lane closures over a weekend to reduce impacts on the local community. The work supports stairwell activities including demolition and concrete pouring.

Access to Wells House Road

To minimise disruption for residents of Wells House Road we will be doing much of the work on the stairs from the footpath on Old Oak Common Lane. This includes concrete pouring and lifting into the steel support structures. Pedestrians will be able to pass along the east side of Old Oak Common Lane throughout our work without interruption. We will be signposting these lane closures clearly from the north and south on large road signs to minimise congestion while making clear that the road remains open to two-way traffic.

Where we will be working

These closures are on limited weekdays and minimise disruption there will be no lane closures over the weekends, please see timetable below. We will update this notification and the community noticeboard when there are programme changes.
