Additional information

Works at the Adelaide Road ventilation shaft site were paused in 2024. From 11 August 2026 we are preparing to restart work to build the ventilation shaft and headhouse.

We will carry out general site activities including carpentry, scaffolding and mechanical works. We will use machinery to break the old concrete foundation at the east end of the site. We will then pour a new concrete foundation and install a new three-storey welfare unit. We will also reconnect site utilities and power.

You may notice an increase in noise during the general site activities. We will use noise reducing barriers where possible.

From **24 August to 18 September 2026** and from **21 September to 2 October 2026** there will be a westbound lane closure on Adelaide Road (as shown on the map below) to facilitate deliveries to site and waste removal. A temporary two-way traffic light system will be in place. Bus stop R will be suspended. The nearest alternative stop is bus stop P on Adelaide Road.

Where we will be working

The lane closure is shown on the map below in red.



Additional information

From **19 to 20 September 2026** Adelaide Road will be closed between the junction with Eton Road and the entrance to Beaumont Walk. This is for safety reasons while the crane is delivered, and the welfare unit is installed. Crane use is subject to weather conditions. If we can't complete the works on the planned dates, we will reschedule for the **26 to 27 September 2026**.

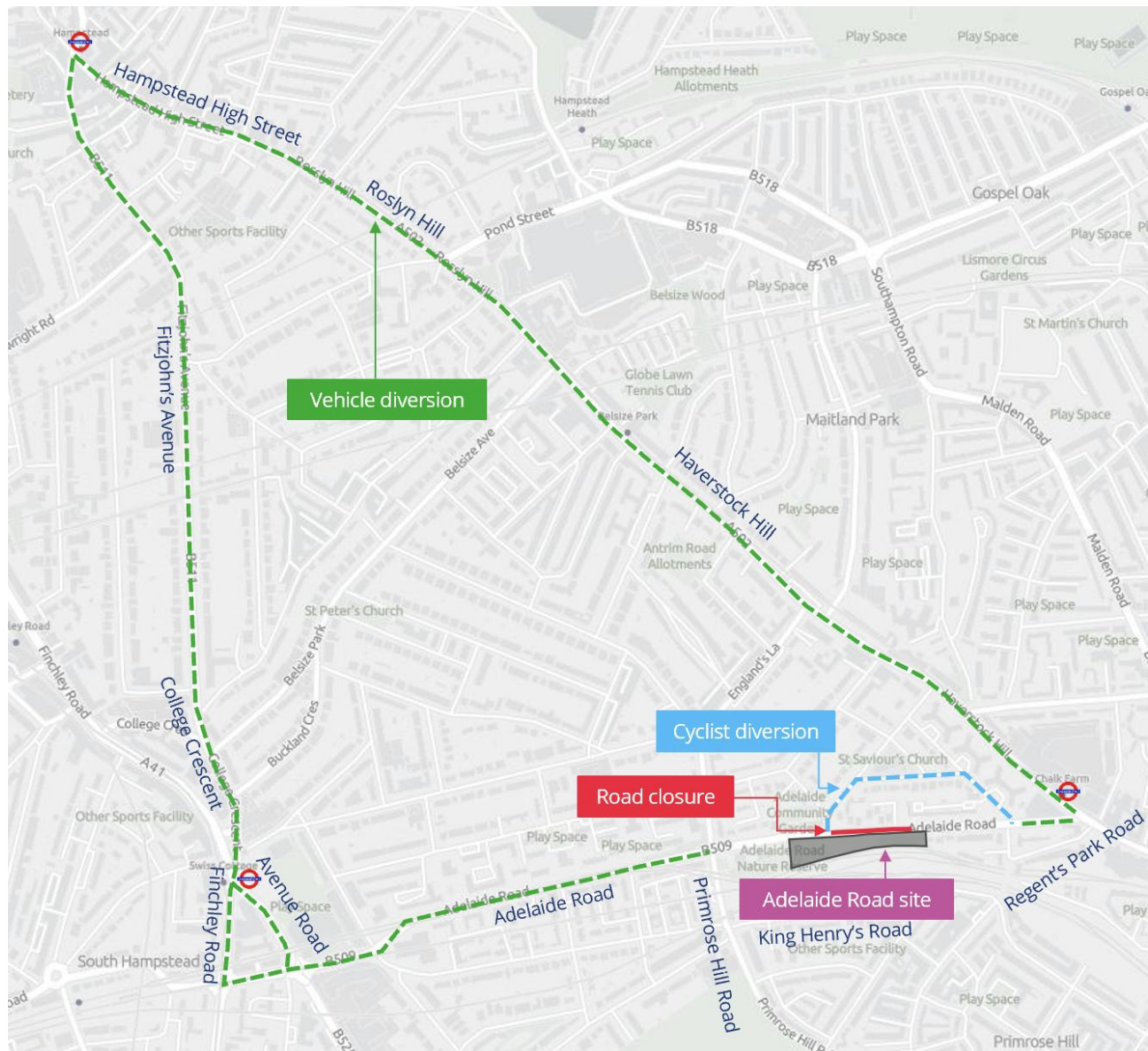
A vehicle diversion and cyclist diversion will be in place. Access to Beaumont Walk will be maintained at all times, assisted by traffic marshals.
