- Temporary suspension of bus stop R

We wrote to you in July about works at our Adelaide Road site.

Ongoing works may include scaffolding and machinery on site. We'll pour concrete foundations and install a new three-storey welfare unit. We're also reconnecting site utilities and power.

You may notice an increase in noise; we'll use noise reducing barriers where possible.

Temporary changes on Adelaide Road

Until **18 September 2026**, the westbound lane closure will remain in place on Adelaide Road with temporary two-way traffic lights.

We told you in July there would be a partial road closure on Adelaide Road from 19 to 20 September. The partial road closure is now planned from **14 to 15 November 2026**. Adelaide Road will be closed between the junction with Eton Road and the entrance to Beaumont Walk.

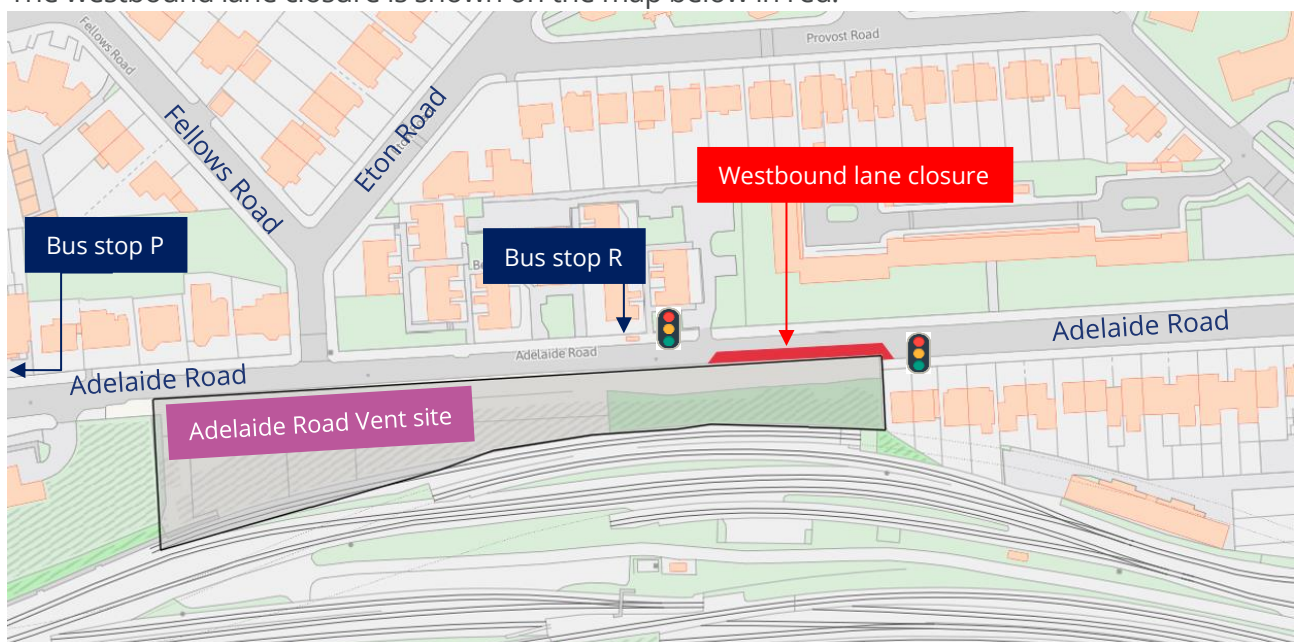
This is for safety reasons while a crane is being delivered, and the new welfare unit is lifted into place. Crane use is subject to weather conditions. If we cannot complete this work on the planned dates, it will be rescheduled to **21 to 22 November 2026**.

There will be a westbound lane closure on Adelaide Road from **16 to 27 November**. Temporary two-way traffic lights will be in place.

Bus stop R will be suspended. The nearest alternative stop is bus stop P on Adelaide Road. For more information on bus routes please visit <https://tfl.gov.uk/bus/status/>

Additional information

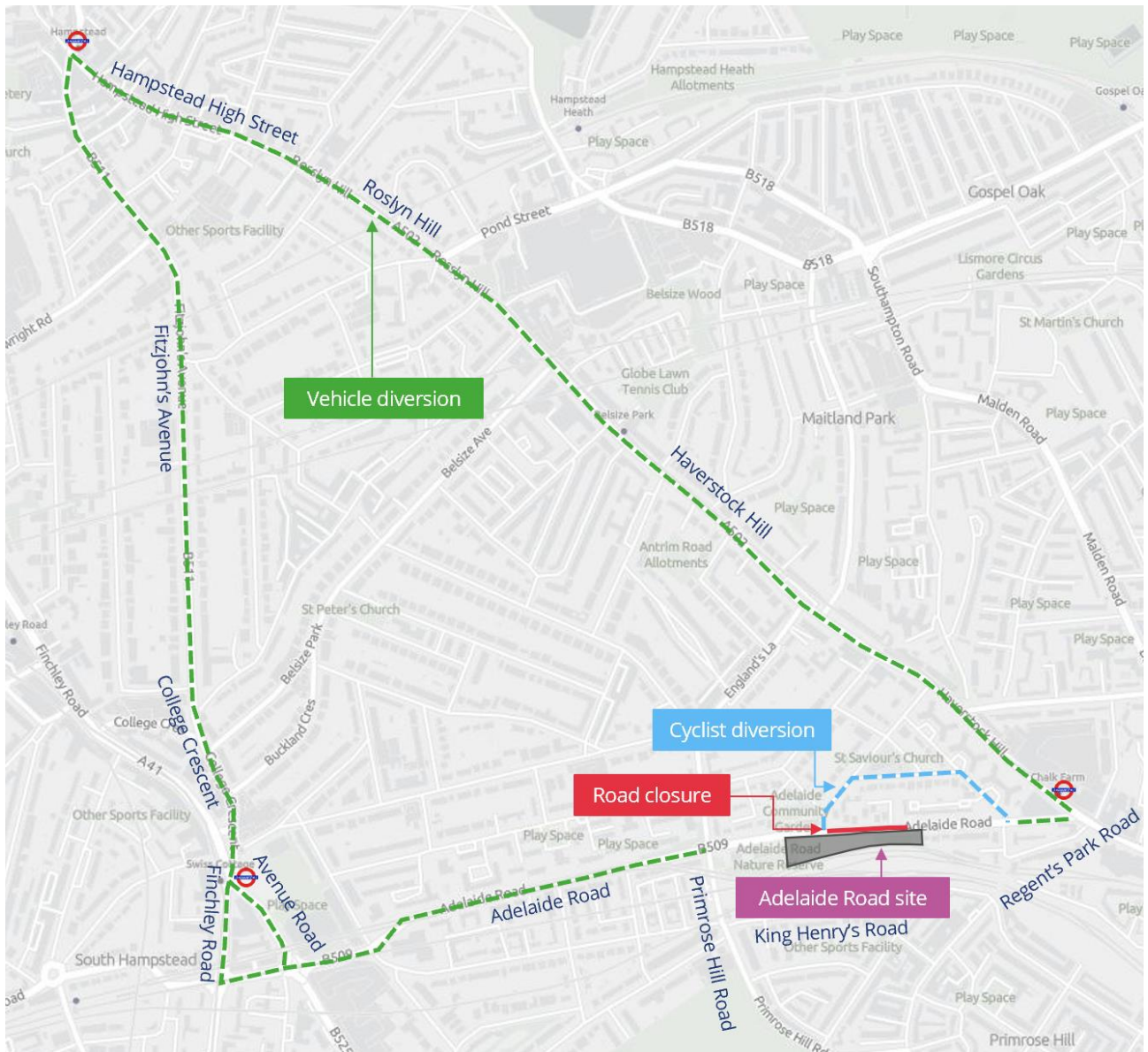
A vehicle and cyclist diversion will be in place during the road closure.
