Demolition of the old Harvil Road bridge

Location

Skip Lane, north and south of the Chiltern railway on Harvil Road

Duration

Friday 11 September from 10pm to 6am
Monday 14 September.

Contingency Friday 18 September from 10pm to 6am Monday 21 September.

What we are doing

We will remove the old Harvil Road bridge on Skip Lane during a rail possession, when no trains are running. A small section of Skip Lane will be closed during this time.

What to expect

Use of machinery to break down the bridge structure and remove materials. You may notice increased noise and vehicle movements.

We will monitor noise levels throughout the works to ensure we stay within the agreed limits.

We apologise for any disruption this work may cause.
